FROM THE PRESIDENT:

Greetings 1148ers!

As a long time geography teacher, amateur sociologist, and current president of a local labor union it probably comes as no surprise that I've been giving a lot of thought to the recent federal, state, and local election results, the demographics of the supporters of the candidates that have both won and lost, and the issues that seemed to drive those voters. People who do this professionally are known as psephologists and while I'm not ready to call myself one of those guite yet, my interest in what these results will mean for our students and our union beginning in January are more than just academic. Much more.



Since the election I have been in a number of meetings with EdMn leaders across the state to understand what comes next. The discussions have ranged from what to do about possible Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) raids, potential restrictions on collective bargaining, attempts to decertify unions, and banning books. These ideas may seem alarmist to some, but they are rooted in **Project 2025** as a part of a wider playbook for what a "conservative victory through policy" might look like, and so they are worth preparing for.

I myself am not alarmed. I am steeled, determined, and inspired! I know that in Minnesota we have some of the most pro-labor legislation on the books anywhere in this country. We have a very strong state statute that protects against book bans, and is lauded by civil libertarians, conservatives, and progressives alike. I know that my union dues go partly to hire the best team of labor/education lawyers that are found anywhere, and who stand ready to fight for our members and our students should their services be required. And I know that my union siblings, sisters, and brothers in Local 1148 will always put the safety and wellbeing of our students above all. I was recently reminded of a quote by my favorite artist of all time, Bruce Springsteen. He said, "Unions have been the only powerful and effective voice working people have ever had in the history of this country." Given that both Harris and Trump appealed directly to union members for their support, with union voter trends not firmly entrenched on either side of the political divide, it is a reminder that this quote rings truer today than ever, and that it also is understood by those that seek to lead this country. Better pay, better pensions, better health care, and safe working conditions are not partisan! They are what unites us in solidarity and in unionism with workers across this state and this country. It reminds me that we can do great things in both times of adversity, and in times of hope. And it reminds me once again, that we are simply stronger together! In solidarity,


